

We All Actually Do Like Change

We all find ourselves longing for a consistent moment or two in our world, especially as we look at the political landscape across the globe.

If you really think about it, though, it becomes clear that we actually **do** like change. As a matter of fact, we love change! We love it when things around us change to fit **our** wishes, wants and needs. We don't like it when **we** have to change, but we are "tickled pink" when the world bends to our angle! And therein lies the problem. We live in a constantly changing society that rarely regards our course and speed when it sets its pace, yet we despise adjusting our trajectory to match that of the world around us. In reality, life rarely yields to us. It is we who must yield to life. Ask anyone who is dealing with a debilitating medical condition. We adjust to such conditions with medication and other such treatments, but we cannot just wish it away. We must change.

Psalm 102:25-27 says, "In the beginning you laid the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. They will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment. Like clothing you will change them and they will be discarded. But you remain the same, and your years will never end."

This text makes one thing very clear: God doesn't change. We

are the ones that adjust ourselves to Him and to life. Lent leading up to Easter is the season that we can intentionally focus on such change. It is a time when we reflect on our lives in an attempt to take a good, hard, honest look at how we are living. Jesus is quoted many times as saying that he yielded to the will of his Father (God). We would do well to do the same.

Where is it that we need to change? In what ways can we do better? How can we be the best that we possibly can be? As we move through the season of Lent and into Holy Week, culminating on Easter Sunday, I ask you to take a look at your own life. In what ways are you resisting God? Are you digging your heals in, refusing to change? Are you stubbornly insisting that the world bend to your wishes? I love the saying that AA embraces, "Let go and let God."

Let go of your will. Let go of your way. Let go of your insistence that your world must conform to your will. Let go, and let God have his way in your life.

Easter is all about life changing anew. Let that positive change be a welcome part of your Easter celebration this year. Blessings,

We seek volunteers to help wash and iron the quilt fabric in addition to looking for volunteers to help select fabric. The fabric will be available for pick up starting Friday, March 1st (during office hours and on Sunday). It needs to be returned back to church no later than Wednesday, March 13th since we will be cutting on March 14th. ALL are welcome (women/men, young/old) to participate in this project. You do not have to know how to sew... you can just come for moral support and fellowship. This is an opportunity to learn different aspects of quilt making. Do you like to work with color and patterns?

Come join us on February 29th or March 14th from 9 am to noon, and help us select fabric. Could you bring some fabric home to launder and iron? We will need help cutting fabric on February 29th to create the quilting kits. We'll have plenty of rotary cutters on hand but if you don't want to cut—you could

help with ironing and putting the kits together. There will be more gathering dates announced when we are ready for the next stage in the quilt making. The beginning of the year is a time when a lot of us start decluttering our homes. We'd welcome any cotton fabric yardage donations.


Based on a true story... After witnessing disease and poverty in the slums of New






Maundy Thursday March 28th at 6PM Worship Service with light soup supper and Sacrament of Communion.

Between the dual joys of Palm Sunday and Easter, we mark the betrayal, denial, and death of Jesus Christ with our Maundy Thursday service of worship. This is the day the Church

traditionally remembers Jesus'

last supper with his disciples and so we will observe the sacrament of communion, followed by a service of Tenebrae, a tradition that dates back to the fourth century. The events marking the last days of Jesus' life on earth are shrouded in darkness and the word 'tenebrae' means 'darkness' or 'shadows.' As the story of Jesus' last hours are recalled, candles are extinguished to signify the gathering forces of evil and the approach of Jesus' death.

Church Scholarships for 2024

As we celebrate our 2024 high school graduates and recognize all members of our church community who are continuing their higher education, the Scholarship Committee announces the request for applications.

Over the years, many of our church members have given funds to provide scholarships for our seniors as they graduate from high school to help them with their upcoming higher education expenses. In recent years, First Congregational Church's Scholarship Fund has been blessed by substantial bequests from long time members, including Virginia Smith and more recently, Gordon P. Woolner in late 2016. Such bequests have enabled the Committee to not only increase the amount of scholarships awarded but to increase the outreach of its awards.

If you are a 2024 high school graduate, a church member starting out on a new career that requires further education, or in the process of attaining a postgraduate degree or certificate, we encourage you to apply.

The First Congregational Scholarships are:

The Senior Scholarship

This award may be given to deserving students and will depend upon the student's potential for new education, activity in the church, academic record, and future plans. Official school transcripts are required.

The Beth Jenkins Ernest Scholarship Award

The Award may be given to a graduating high school senior young woman who shows high potential for new education, activity in the church, academic record, and future plans. Official school transcripts are required. An essay of 300 words is also required in response to the following question: *How do I intend to express the values of First Congregational Church in my future career?* The recipient will present her essay to the congregation in Scholarship Sunday.

The William P McGuiness Scholarship Award

The Award may be given to a graduating high school senior young man who shows high potential for new education, activity in the church, academic record, and future plans. Official school transcripts are required. An essay of 300 words is also required in response to the following question: *How do I intend to express the values of First Congregational Church in my future career?* The recipient will present his essay to the congregation in Scholarship Sunday.

A New Chapter Award

This award is reserved for active church members who may decide to take a new road in life, to enter a "new chapter." Perhaps this new pathway may be to pursue new schooling or enter a new career that requires further education.

The Higher Education Award

This award may be given to students who have graduated from high school who are continuing their education, whether or not they have received a Church Scholarship in the past. The intent of this award is to support our church members as they continue to pursue their education either at college undergraduate or postgraduate level or in pursuit of certificate jobs training programs. Students will be asked to respond to an essay question about how their foundation from FCC has affected their college careers and why/what they are doing and planning to do as they move forward.

If you are interested in applying for any of the scholarships please let us know, and we will provide you with the appropriate Scholarship Application. Please be aware that First Congregational Church's Scholarship program is a merit-based program for members of the church as of the application deadline.

All Scholarship Applications should be submitted by May 15, 2024.
