

#### The Dark Night of the Soul

Psalm 22:1-3 A Psalm of David. My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, so far from the words of my groaning? <sup>2</sup> O my God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer, by night, and am not silent. <sup>3</sup> Yet you are enthroned as the Holy One; you are the praise of Israel.

Here we are in the middle of winter. It's cold. It gets dark so early in the afternoon and the sun doesn't rise until after 7 a.m.. We tend to not get out nearly as much in the winter which means that our physical activity is lower than usual. As a result, we are more grumbly, irritable and gloomy. In short, we have the winter blues. For some, this is just a small, temporary change in mood that easily corrects itself when the warmer days of late winter and spring arrive. For others, this can turn into a full-fledged depressive state of being. The illness of depression is receiving more and more attention, yet it is still perceived by so many as a stigma. It's a source of shame and embarrassment for millions of people that suffer from what's often called, "the dark night of the soul." This shouldn't be!

David no doubt struggled with his own seasons of darkness throughout his life. Whether it was fearing for his life while being pursued by King Saul or dealing with the consequences of his mistake with Bathsheba, he certainly had times of struggle. The Psalm I've chosen today reflects one of those dark nights. David felt that God had abandoned him, and indeed, in our darkest nights, we can feel the same way. It is encouraging, however, to

realize that Jesus felt the same way that we do. He actually quoted this Psalm in His darkest moment on the cross!

Depression is a serious thing, and you should never try and cover it up or hide it from the people around you. Chances are you won't be able to anyway because the people that know and love you are probably more perceptive than you think. Rather, why not seek help in your struggle? There are so many qualified people who have helped so many through exactly what you are dealing with. If you need help, then first admit it to yourself and to the people that you love. Those that love you will want to help in whatever way they can. If you attend FCC on a regular basis, then you already have many people here that love you and will help you to find a good friend, counselor, pastor (I know of one!), or mentor to walk with you through the dark night. Before long you will find yourself emerging into a fresh new morning!

Even Jesus' darkest moments in the garden of Gethsemane turned into the brilliant joy of his resurrection morning! Let God do the same for you. He has so much in store for you, just waiting for you to receive it. God's blessings to you...



#### **Open & Affirming Committee** February 2025 News and Reflections

"Draw the circle wide. No one stands alone, we'll stand side by side." From the choir anthem, composed by Mark Miller

The lyrics of the choir anthem of January 19 reminded us of the promises of FCC's Open and Affirming Covenant, in which we affirm "...that each individual is a child of God and that all are worthy of God's love and grace." We revisit the covenant regularly, because it guides our thinking and our efforts on behalf of marginalized groups in our faith community and the greater Manchester area, as it did during the *Conversation* about the homeless last November.

While the homeless population may be less visible during these cold winter months, our prayers for shelter and safe-ty continue for this group – much in need of grace, support,

resources, and hope. Our own Maryann Linscott has shared her journey through being homeless. Please read her story, published with her permission in the sidebar to this article. Thank you, Maryann! Justin May summed up our responses to her story.

"This is very inspiring- and is a true testament to what faith, friends, and resilience can do to help someone get through even the toughest of times. We are very blessed to have Maryann in our lives!"

In 2025, our group will continue to support the Interfaith Coalition of the Homeless. Pastor Chris and Pat Long are integral members of the coalition, which meets regularly at FCC. A training session for homeless support is scheduled for May, and we will support that effort. Other plans include

our annual participation in Manchester Pride in June. We will also arrange for FCC folks to attend *"Considering Matthew Shepard,"* an acclaimed oratorio to be performed by Manchester Choral Society in June.



The Open and Affirming Committee, with support of Pastors Chris and Barbara, and other FCC groups, strives to stimulate learning and spiritual growth and offer loving service to the Manchester community. The words of our Open and Affirming Covenant are

inclusive. We seek to "draw the circle wide." As we took stock of our efforts in 2024, we focused on mental health with a *Conversation* with Randy VanDeventer, we celebrated America's diversity and rich musical traditions when we organized a concert trip to hear the American Spiritual Ensemble, we engaged with and supported the LGBT+ community at Manchester Pride, and focused on the humanity of the homeless and the challenges they face when we met in November for a *Conversation* with Pastor Chris, Pat Long, and Randy VanDeventer.

#### My story by Maryann Linscott

In 2022 my mother and I were evicted from our apartment and moved in with my Aunt Jill (my mother's sister). Then my mother got cancer and went to a nursing home to be looked after until she died.

My Aunt became my guardian and she began to yell at me. I started running away and I missed my Mom. My Aunt would call the cops to look for me and finally she said she couldn't take it anymore so she dropped me off at the Shelter in Manchester (the Adult Emergency Shelter).

I lived there for 8 months and I had no hope but I got the help I needed and now I live in my own apartment. I have a part time job at Hannaford's in Goffstown. I have a job coach, therapist, and a case worker called Paige. I have a cat called Princess who is so much fun and keeps me company.

I go to church every Sunday, and I volunteer with them to work at Families in Transition and other places, to give back. I've been involved with Special Olympics for 15 years as a competitor and volunteer. I got baptized at my church and I have a God Mother and we talk every day.

I have my church family and my work family. My Aunt Jill is no longer my guardian, I am my own! I am so proud that I can prove to everyone and myself that I can do it!
