Funny creatures, we are. We seem to be the most powerful creatures on this earth, but that is only relatively speaking. A tiny bacteria or virus that seems so small and powerless against our strength and superior intelligence can devastate the entire human race (and indeed this has happened recently and perhaps will happen again). Conversation Café is All the Talk

English for New Americans (ENA), an education service of Community Action Partnership of Hillsborough and Rockingham counties (CAPHR), offers English classes in Manchester for adult refugees, immigrants and limited English speaking residents who have settled in the community. Classes are held at the First Congregational Church and provide English learners instruction in speaking, reading and writing.

ENA also offers special events and programs including Conversation Café. Since 2011, FCC volunteers have hosted ENA students for monthly conversations giving students the opportunity to practice talking with native English speakers in a casual, friendly environment.

ENA recently partnered with FCC to hold Conversation Café twice weekly for 5 weeks. Thanks to Liz Verity and the amazing group of volunteers – Ann Friedman, Carol Ann Howe, Linda Radcliffe, Janie Shaklee, Rebecca Sharkey, Pat Turcotte, Jamie Vanagel and Noel Villiard - who generously offered their time, the program was a huge success. Students enjoyed engaging in conversations on a myriad of topics, reading and discussing short stories and playing games to enhance their English language skills.

ENA and FCC are excited to continue this partnership and are looking forward to cohosting other fun, cultural and educational events during the 2025/2026 school year.

SERVE IN OUR COMMUNITY

A New Volunteer Opportunity in our neighborhood to help the Homeless!

1269 Café Ministries, just 1 block away from FCC in the old St. Cashmir's school building has been a Christian street-outreach for the homeless, and those living on the edge in Manchester for over 12 years. They are a non-profit 501C3 organization located in Manchester, NH 03103.

Their purpose is to live out God's instruction as set forth in Matthew 25:40. "...Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

Their mission is to assist marginalized and unhoused patrons to get back on their

feet in a safe, wholesome and sober environment, effectively decreasing the recurrence of homelessness. They do this by providing a variety of services such as hot meals, showers, clothing, laundry service short term storage lockers, and an extensive food pantry. In addition, there are health care specialists on site, and comprehensive case management to assist with housing and jobs.



Where does FCC fit in?

"The Twelve" as it is known, has many volunteer opportunities which our FCC Community can take part in, starting with their **Outreach Cafe**. The café provides approximately 150 meals every weekday during break fast and lunch service. Volunteers are needed to assist with some food preparation, serve café guests, and do light clean-up.

Our plan is to cover every Wednesday lunch from 11am-1pm starting on August 13th. There is a sign-up sheet on the volunteer boards for August and first weeks of September - sign up for one or as many as you can make time for.

Starting in September we will also be doing a clothing drive for 1269's Compassion Closet...see details below...

What impressed us was that this was not a shopping experience, such as Outfitters it is meant to supply a person who has no resources to shop.

First Congregational Church has been deeply rooted in the history and culture of Manchester for nearly 200 years. Throughout these two centuries, this dynamic congregation has been a leader amongst the churches, making significant contributions to the spiritual and social well-being of Manchester. As our culture progresses further into a changing world of technology and communications, it is important for us to embrace these new methods with the same enthusiasm that we have always shown. There is a brand-new realm of opportunity that awaits FCC as we have yet only scratched the surface of the possibilities.

The recent retirement of our Associate Pastor gives us the opportunity to review the best use of staff positions, while making sure all important aspects of church life are maintained. The congregational care that was a large part of the Associate Pastor's role is being maintained by our Parish Visitors and Kindness Team. These are outstanding groups that deeply care for the members and friends of FCC and offer truly meaningful love and support to this church family.

They gave me pointers in how to traverse the roots. They put out a hand to help when I needed it for balance or the next step required longer legs than I have. One woman even carried my camera part of the way and took pictures to prove that I made to the top. This group made sure no one was left behind and it was all done in caring and gentle ways.
